Privacy Statement (for Website)



This privacy statement explains what personal information we collect from you and how we use it.

PCP collects information to operate effectively and provide you with the best experience with our services. You provide some of this information directly, such as when you complete a registration form or when you contact us for support by email. PCP also indirectly collects this information for example calling number identification that provides the name and telephone number of a caller, which appears on a display as the call is received.

Information PCP collects about you:

PCP keeps records about you and the service/support you have received, this information may include:

- contact details about you, for example, name, address and next of kin
- equality and diversity data
- contact we have had e.g. appointments/meetings notes about the support received, including any advice and care
- information about how our support has affected you, e.g. evaluation data, comments cards, case studies, focus groups, etc.
- relevant information from people who support you and know you, for example, professionals, referrers and relatives

PCP uses your information to:

- decide what support/advice is appropriate and relevant to you
- enable us to work with others providing you with support/advice
- properly investigate your concerns if you raise a complaint

Your personal information will be stored by PCP and Aspire Technology Solution who back up PCP's servers and will be treated as confidential under the Data Protection Act.

PCP is required to keep different types of information for different periods of time. PCP Retention Schedule will ensure compliance

Online Services

PCP's website

When someone visits www.pcp.uk.net we use a third party service, Google Analytics, to collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns. We do this to find out things such as the number of visitors to the various parts of the site. This information is only processed in a way which does not identify anyone. We do not make, and do not allow Google to make any attempt to find out the identities of those visiting our website. If we do want to collect personally identifiable information through our website, we will be up front about this. We will make it clear when we collect personal information and will explain what we intend to do with it.

Cookies

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site. The table below explains the cookies we use and why.

Google Analytics	These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our website and WordPress blog. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the website. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the website and blog, from where visitors have come to the website and the pages they visited. Twitter	This cookie embeds PCP's Twitter feed into our Website. Twitter may receive information including the web page you visited, your IP address, browser type, operating system, and cookie information. Read privacy policy

PCP uses a third party service, WordPress.com, to publish <u>our blog</u>. These sites are hosted at WordPress.com, which is run by Automattic Inc. We use a standard WordPress service to collect anonymous information about users' activity on the site, for example the number of users viewing pages on the site, to monitor and report on the effectiveness of the site and help us improve it. PCP gathers statistics around email opening and clicks using industry standard technologies to help us monitor and improve our e-newsletter. PCP's Online Survey's

PCP uses a third party service, SurveyMonkey, to seek feedback from users for a variety of reasons. The reason for the survey and how we will use this information will always be clearly identified in the survey introduction. We will use the information only in ways that will not identify anyone, and we will not make any attempt to identify anyone from the information we collect. PCP's Online Competition's

Occasionally PCP will offer prizes to clients to encourage them to complete a survey. PCP uses a third party service, SurveyMonkey, to seek feedback from users for a variety of reasons. The reason for the survey and how we will use this information will always be clearly identified in the survey introduction. We will use the information only in ways that will **not** identify anyone. Once a competition is drawn, all personal information will be deleted. People who call PCP

When you call PCP we collect calling number identification (CNID) information. We use this information to help improve our efficiency and effectiveness and to monitor any malicious/threatening calls. In the event of a malicious/threatening call PCP will report these incidents to the police.

Marketing and Press Activities

PCP will request consent to use photo, video images and written case studies that feature clients. Once consent is granted these images and stories will appear in the public domain and as such may be reproduced by other parties, examples of where these may be used are:

Your rights

Under the General Data Protection Regulation 2018, you have rights as an individual which you can exercise in relation to the information we hold about you. Access to personal information

Individuals can find out if we hold any personal information by making a 'subject access request' under the General Data Protection Regulation 2018. If we do hold information about you we will:

- give you a description of it;
- tell you why we are holding it;
- tell you who it could be disclosed to; and
- let you have a copy of the information

If you wish to make a subject access request for any personal information PCP may hold you need to put the request in writing addressing it to the Head of Business Excellence. If PCP does hold information about you, you can ask us to correct any mistakes by, once again, contacting in writing the Head of Business Excellence.

Disclosure of personal information

PCP will not disclose personal data without consent, unless there is:

- a risk of harm to you or other people
- where PCP believes that the reasons for sharing are so important that they override our obligation of confidentiality (for example, to support the investigation and prosecution of offenders or to prevent serious crime)
- where PCP has been instructed to do so by a Court
- where PCP is legally required to do so

However when PCP investigates a complaint, for example, we may need to share personal information with a third party organisation concerned or other relevant bodies. Further information is available in our leaflet: How we use your information.

Sharing your information:

PCP may share your information internally to:

- other PCP staff members supporting the service
- PCP volunteers supporting the service
- refer you to another PCP service
- PCP staff conducting audits of data i.e. Equality & Diversity data analysis/evaluations for reporting or bid writing purposes.

Where PCP shares information for statistical purposes, we take strict measures to ensure that you cannot be identified.

PCP may share your information externally to:

- the organisation that funds the service enabling PCP to provide the service
- other organisations or services that we refer you to for support
- other providers involved in supporting you, for example GP's, NHS, or private sector/voluntary sector providers etc.

You will be asked for your consent to share information in this way on PCP Registration Form.

PCP may be contacted **for your consent** to share your information, with; social services, education services, local authorities, legal proceedings or other voluntary sector providers or to:

- check the quality of support/advice PCP gave you with an external organisation
- help investigate any concerns or complaints you have raised

This information will be subject to information sharing protocols about how it will be used. PCP holds your records in strict confidence. Anyone who receives information from PCP also has a legal duty to keep it confidential.

Complaints or queries

PCP aims to meet the highest standards when collecting and using personal information. For this reason, we take any complaints we receive about this very seriously. We encourage people to bring it to our attention if they think that our collection or use of information is unfair, misleading or inappropriate.
